

Appointments at Eurovia June 23, 2010

In support of its development at the international level, Eurovia has strengthened its Executive Committee.

Pierre Anjolras joined Eurovia on May 1, 2010 as Delegate Executive Director, International and Public-Private Partnerships. Mr. Anjolras is an engineer and graduate of École polytechnique and École des ponts et chaussées. He held successive positions at the departmental office of infrastructure for the Loire-Atlantique region and the Directorate-General for External Relations at the European Commission before joining the VINCI Group in 1999 as Regional Director at Sogea Sud-Ouest. In 2004, he was appointed Director of Operations at Cofiroute; and in 2007, he was appointed Executive Director at ASF.

Guy Vacher, formerly Assistant Executive Director, has been appointed Delegate Executive Director, responsible for France, Belgium, Railway Works, and Specialized Subsidiaries. Mr. Vacher is an engineer and graduate of École spéciale des travaux publics. He joined Viafrance in 1979 as a works engineer. In 1986, he was appointed Director of the Bois d'Arcy division. Within the Company, which became Eurovia in 1997, he held the positions of Director at the regional and, later, national level. He was appointed to the Eurovia Executive Committee in 1999.

Dominique Collomp is an engineer and graduate of Institut national des sciences appliquées at Lyon. He has been appointed Deputy Managing Director, responsible for Germany and Central Europe. He has been part of the Eurovia Executive Committee since 2008. Following a 22-year career at the international level with the Colas Group, where he held the position of Executive Director (International-East), he joined Eurovia in 2004.

Eurovia, a VINCI subsidiary, is a European leader in the construction and maintenance of road and rail transport infrastructures. With operations in 17 countries, the company has 41,500 employees and generated revenue of €8 billion in 2009.
